Midway 2009 Residential Sound Insulation Program

Four Bid Packages Issued

The City of Chicago, Department of Aviation, has advertised four bid packages for the Midway 2009 Residential Sound Insulation Program.

All bid packages include sound insulation construction work for single-family homes, townhomes with up to four dwelling units, as well as two-flat, three-flat, and four-flat residences in neighborhoods surrounding Midway International Airport.

Bid Package 1 includes 500 homes. The estimated bid range for this package is \$9 - \$10 million.
