WHICH CAREER LOOKS

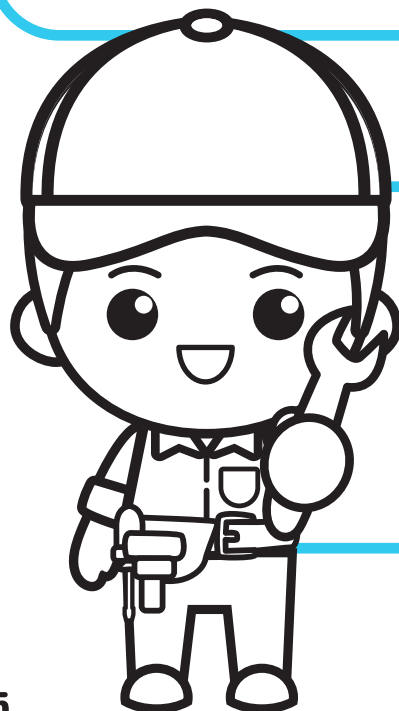


PILOT

They safely fly the plane. Did you know most flights have two pilots? There are the Captain, who is in charge, and the Co-Pilot, who is called the First Officer. Do you want to learn how to fly?

AIR TRAFFIC CONTROLLER

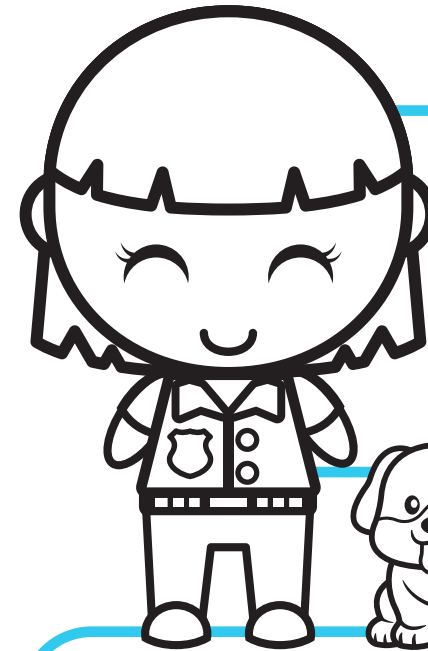
They help pilots take off, fly and land safely. They also direct planes in the air and keep each plane a safe distance from one another. Can you spot an air traffic control tower at the airport?



AIRCRAFT MECHANIC

They inspect, test, repair and maintain the planes so they are safe to fly. Do you know all the parts of a plane? They know how to fix engines, landing gear, brakes, the controls and more.

INTERESTING TO YOU?

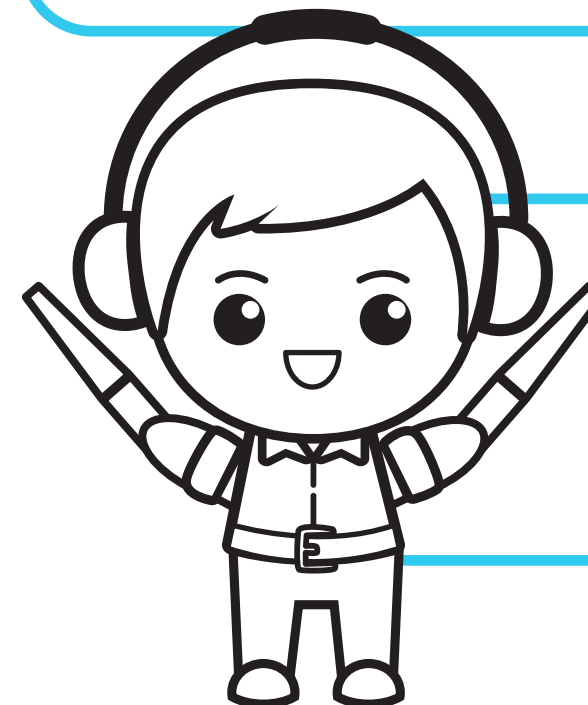
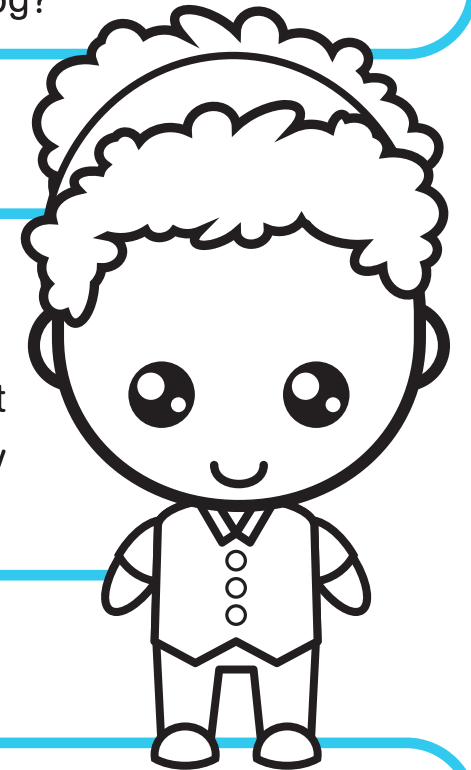


SECURITY OFFICER

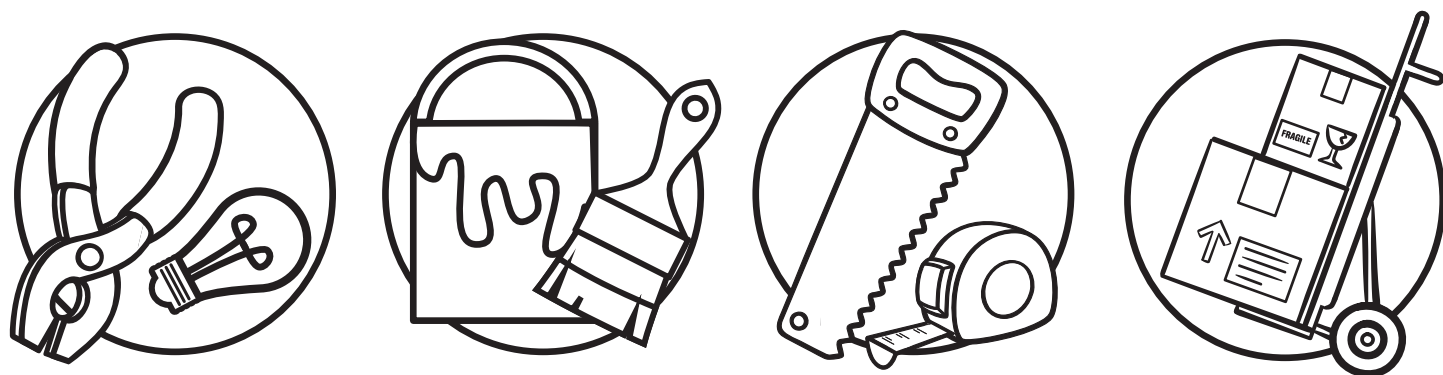
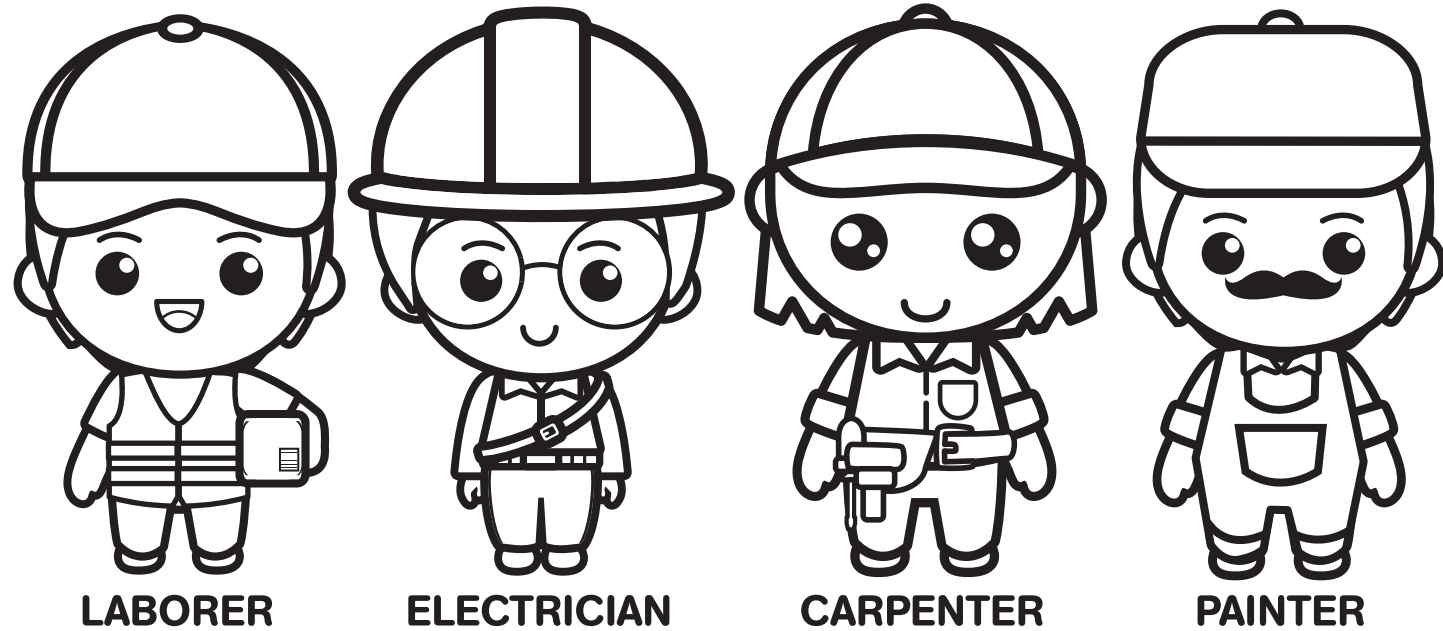


RAMP AGENT

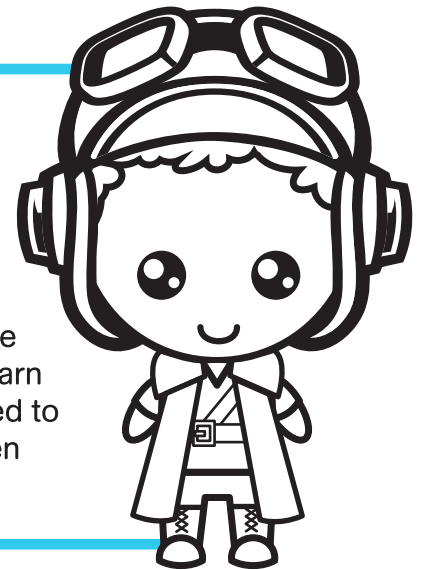


MEET BESSIE COLEMAN.

DID YOU KNOW?

In 1915, **Bessie Coleman** lived in Chicago working as a manicurist at the White Sox Barber Shop. There, she heard stories of flying from pilots returning home from World War I.

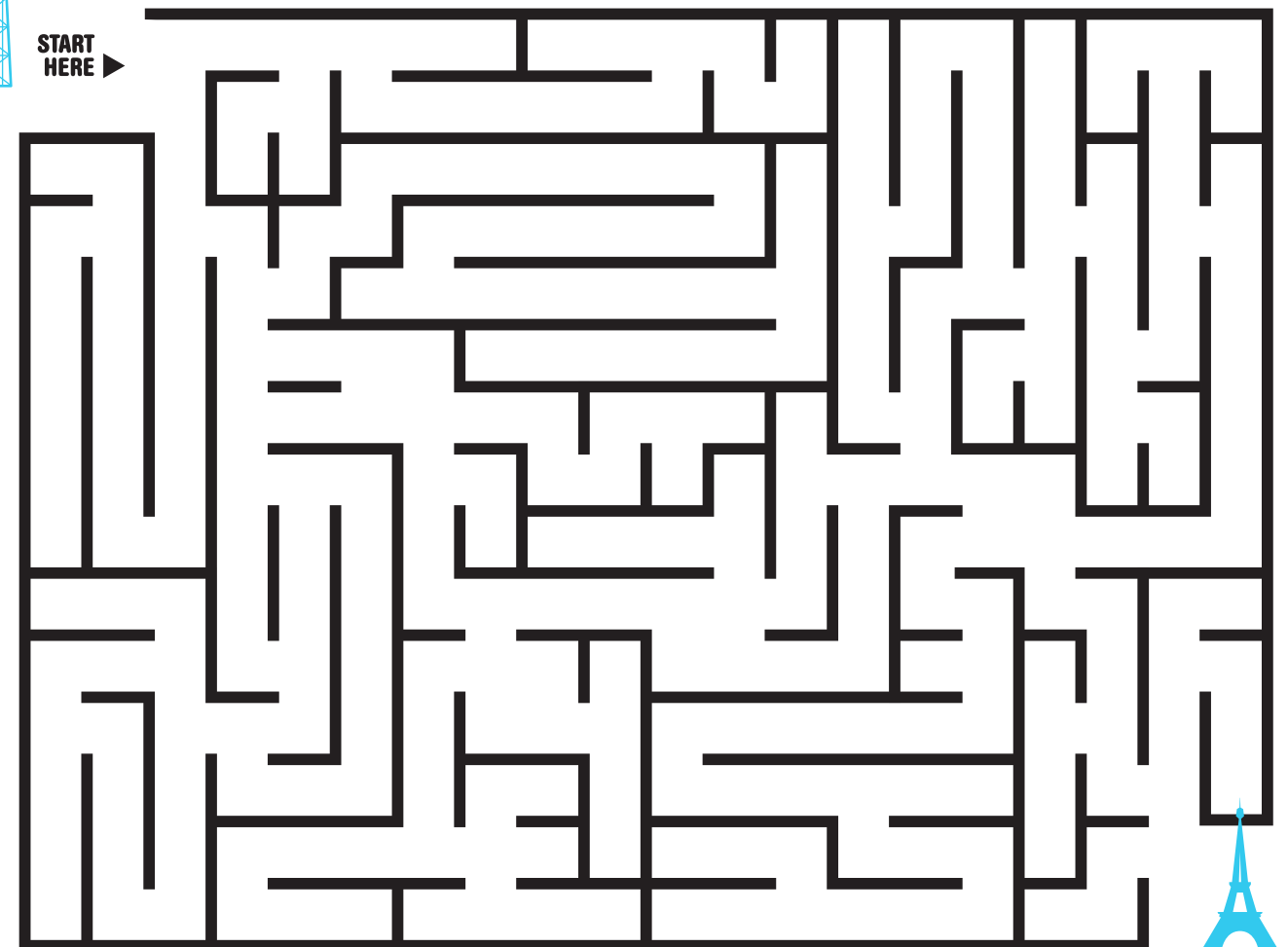
This interested Bessie so much that she traveled to Paris to earn her pilot's license. In 1921, she became the first Black woman and first Native American to earn an international aviation license. Bessie then returned to America where she became a media sensation, often being called "Queen Bess" and "Brave Bessie."

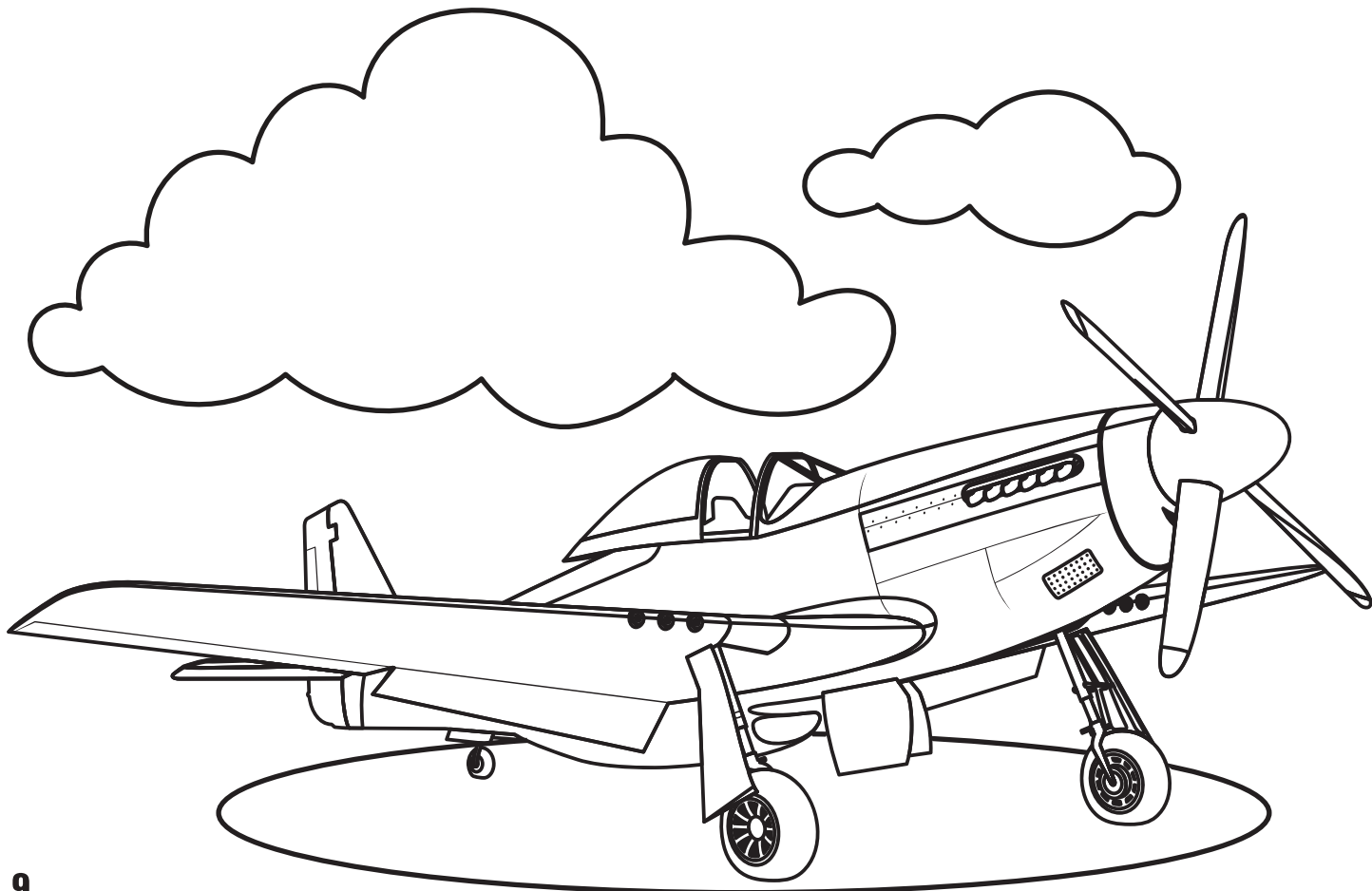


WILLA BROWN & THE TUSKEGEE AIRMEN.

DID YOU KNOW

Willa Brown, an extraordinary Chicagoan, was the very first Black woman to earn a pilot's license in the United States.

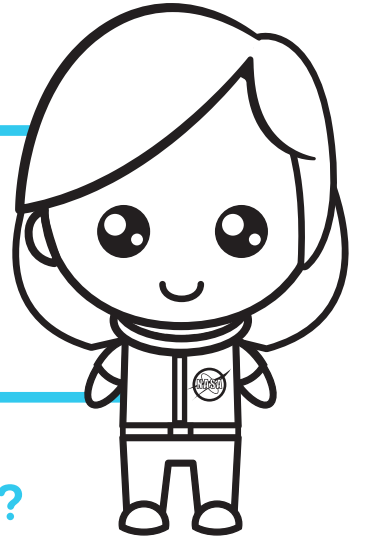
In 1940, just before the U.S. entered World War II, the country had a serious shortage of pilots. Willa Brown had the answer: train young Black men to fly for the military. Nearly 200 students she trained at her flight school went on to join the Tuskegee Airmen, the first Black fighter pilots and crew in the U.S. Army Air Corps.

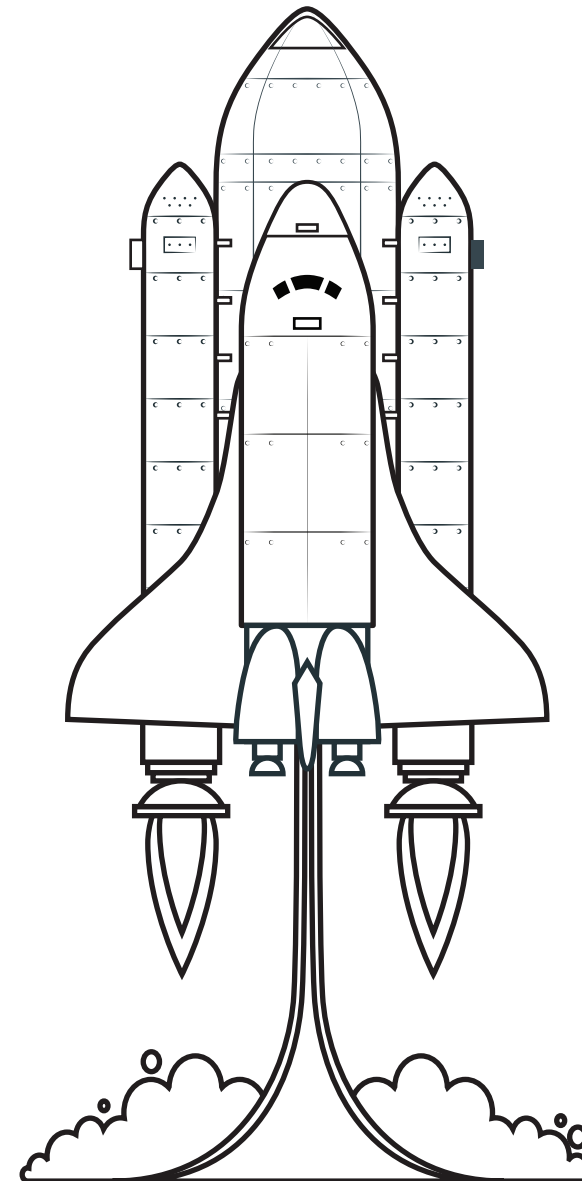
DID YOU KNOW

Ellen Ochoa was the first Hispanic woman to go to space on a nine-day mission aboard the Space Shuttle Discovery in 1993. She was also the first Hispanic director and the second female director of the Johnson Space Center.



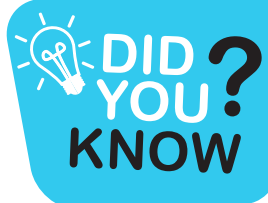

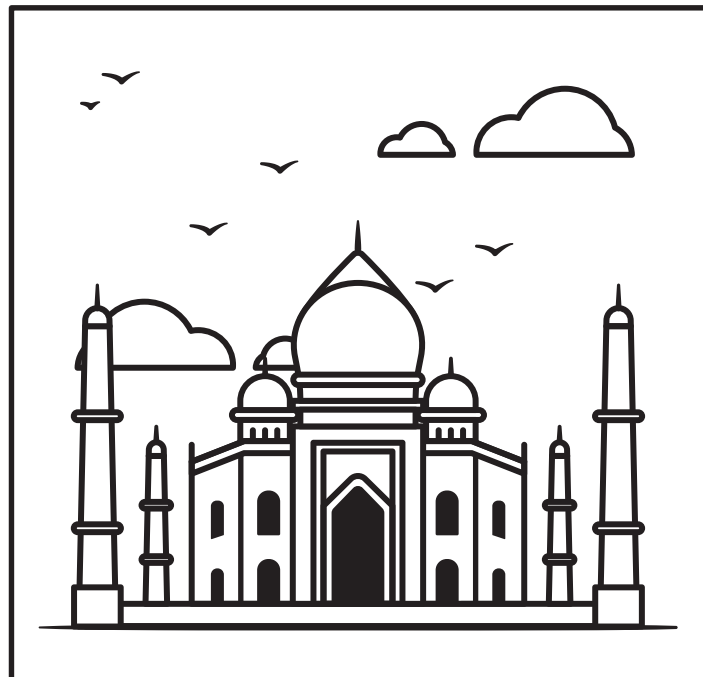

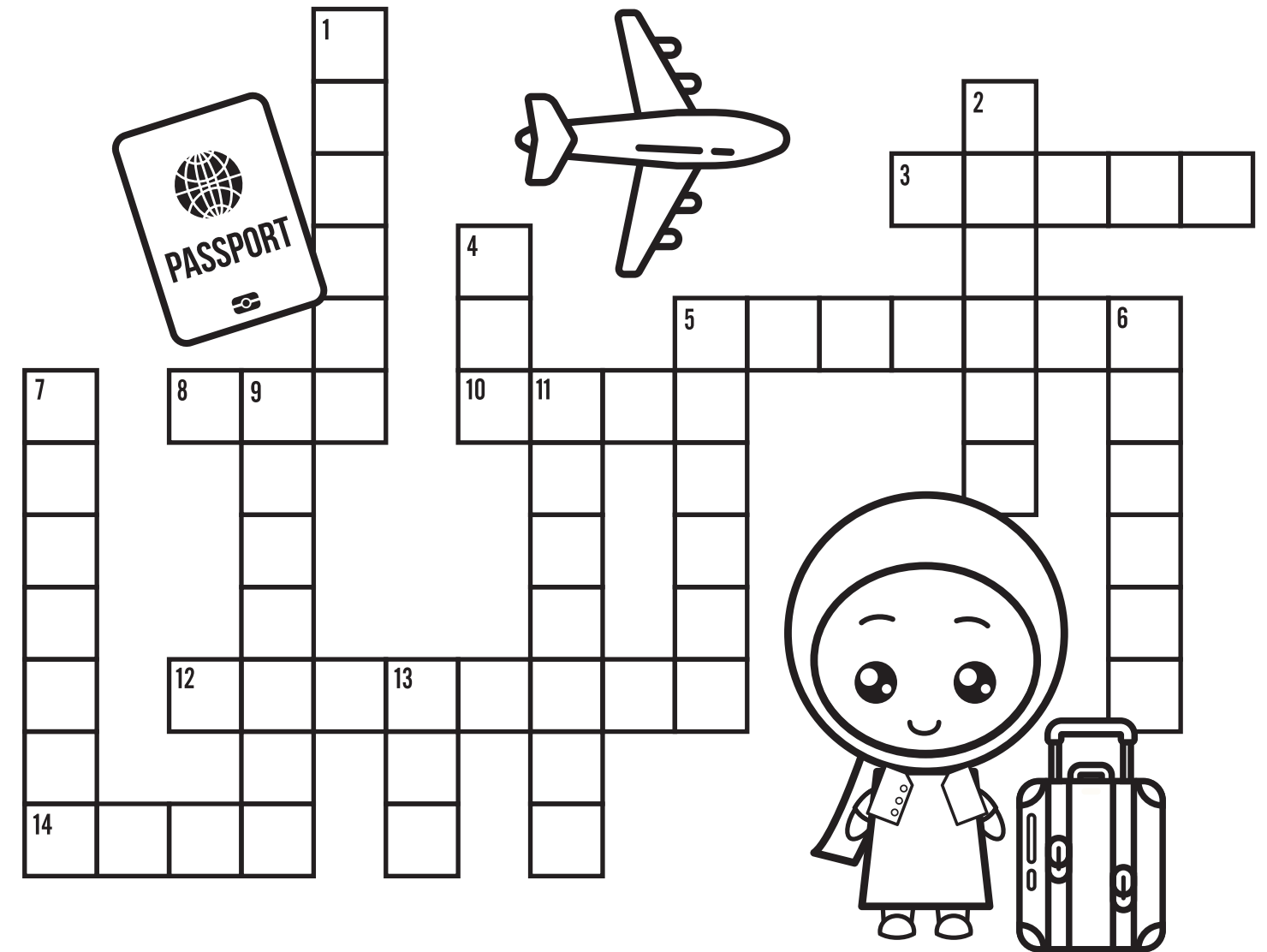
FLY AROUND THE WORLD.

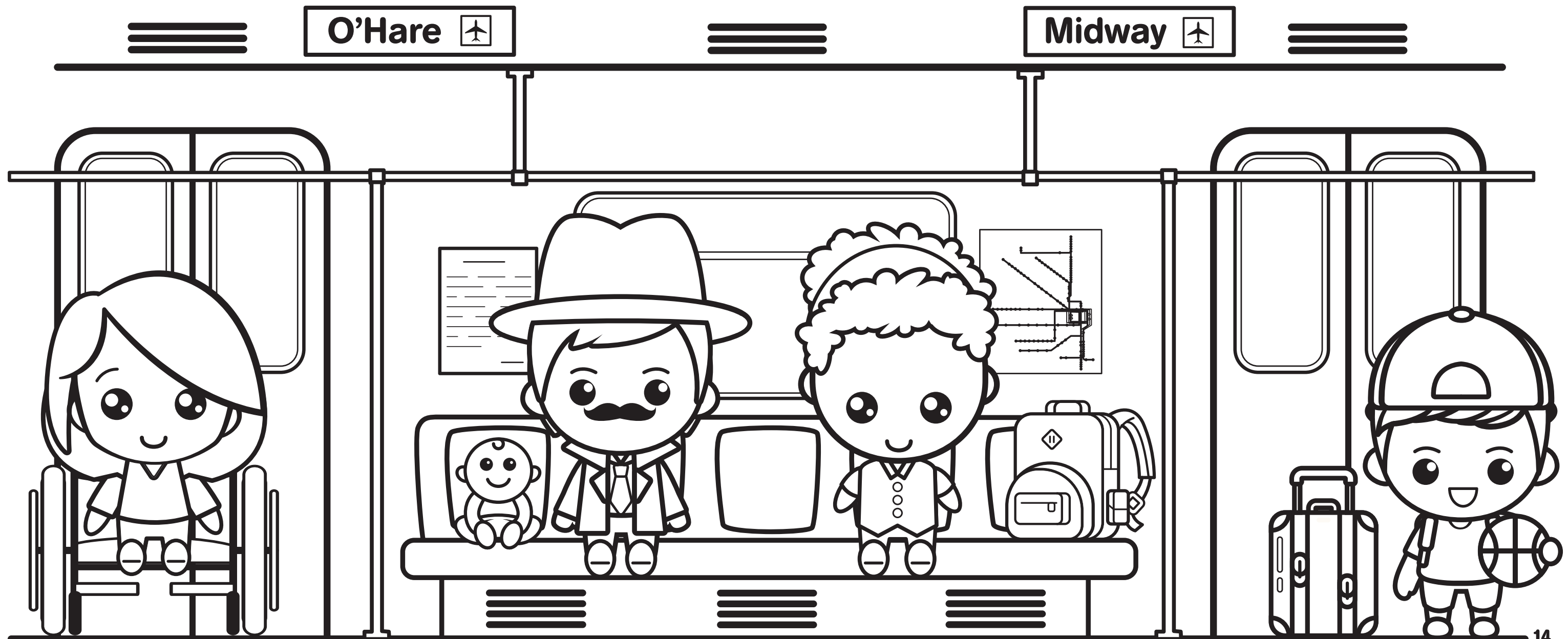
TAKE THE TRAIN TO & FROM THE AIRPORT.

DID YOU KNOW?

- The Blue Line is a 26.93-mile-long (43.34 km) Chicago 'L' line that travels between the downtown Loop and O'Hare Station.
- The Blue Line is the longest line of the CTA 'L' train system and second busiest.

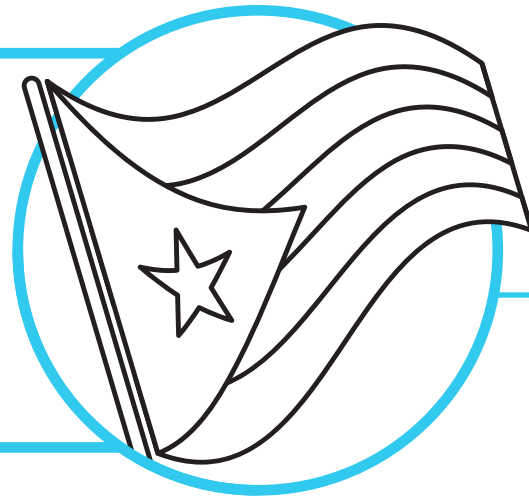
DID YOU KNOW?

- The Orange Line is approximately 13 miles (21 km) long running from the downtown Loop to Midway Station.
- The Orange Line opened for service on October 31, 1993, and was the first extension to the CTA system since the O'Hare Airport Extension of the Blue Line in September 1984.



Humboldt Park

The Puerto Rican community in **Humboldt Park** holds yearly parades and festivals with plenty of food, dancing and vendors keeping the heritage alive. You can also visit the National Museum of Puerto Rican Arts and Culture, built in 1895. It is one of the oldest surviving buildings in Humboldt Park and was used to hold horses and landscape equipment.



Pilsen

Pilsen is a Mexican American neighborhood that is definitely worth a visit! Aside from its great food, it is also known for the murals and mosaics that are spread throughout the neighborhood. You can also visit the National Museum of Mexican Art for a trip through Mexican artwork and artists from past to present.



Chinatown

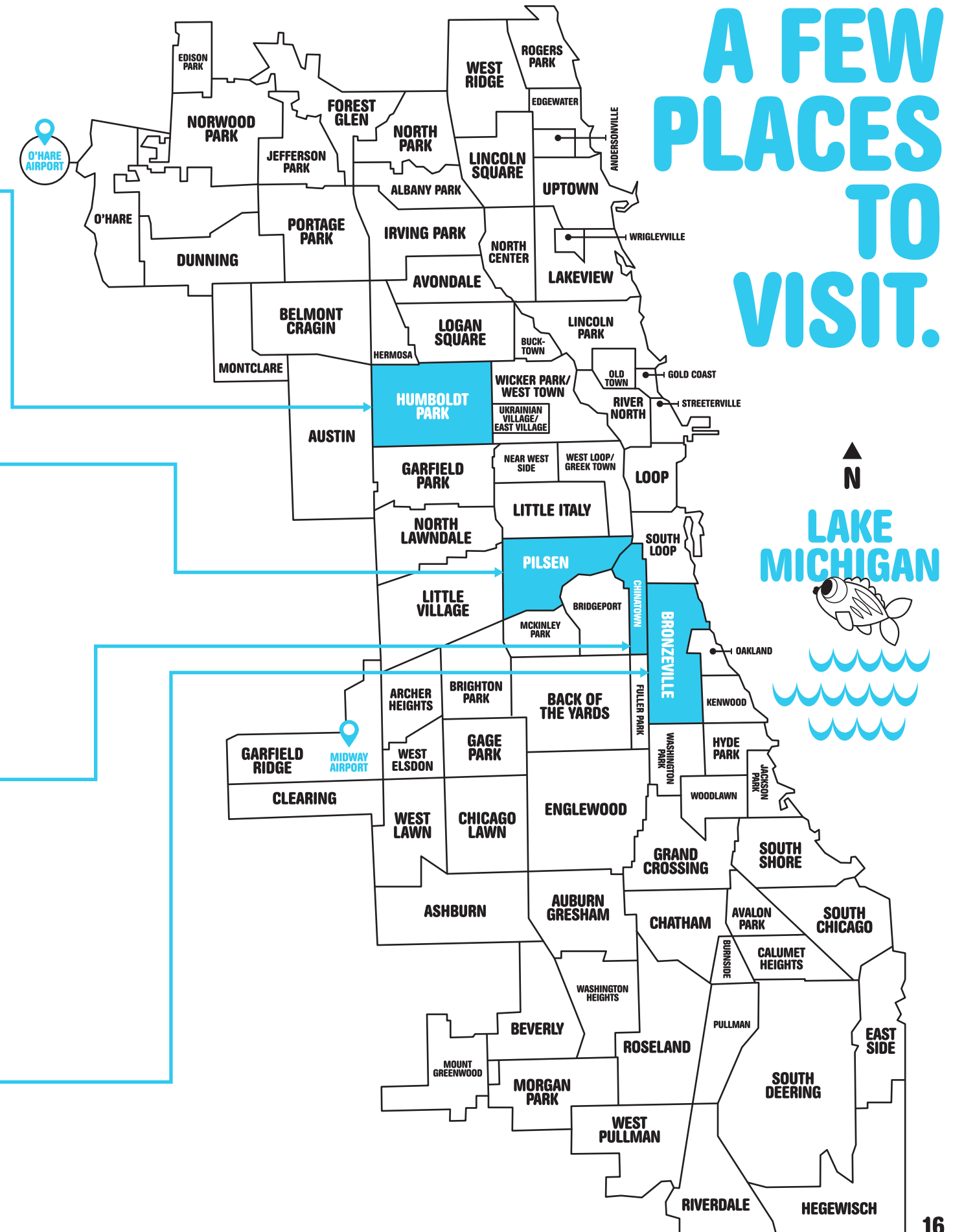
This is absolutely a spectacular place to see and you can get there by car or by water taxi. Chinatown Square is the center of the action in **Chicago's Chinatown**. Here you'll be able to try Chinese food from a number of different restaurants or visit shops where you can buy Chinese herbs, knick-knacks, and all sorts of other goods.



Bronzeville

Historically known as the Black Metropolis, **Bronzeville** is the center for African American culture in Chicago. On Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Drive is the home of civil rights activist Ida B. Wells. You can also see the Monument to the Great Northern Migration, honoring the African Americans who traveled from the South to Chicago between 1910 to 1970.

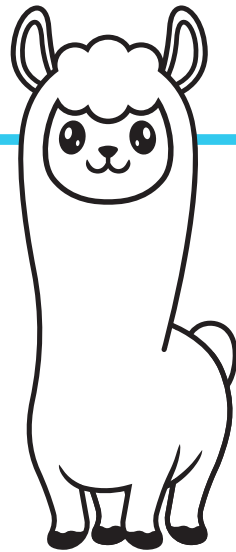
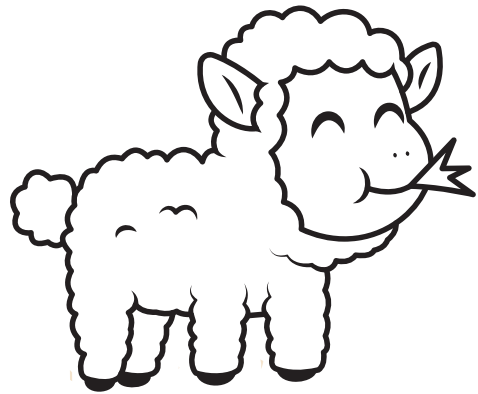

DID YOU KNOW?

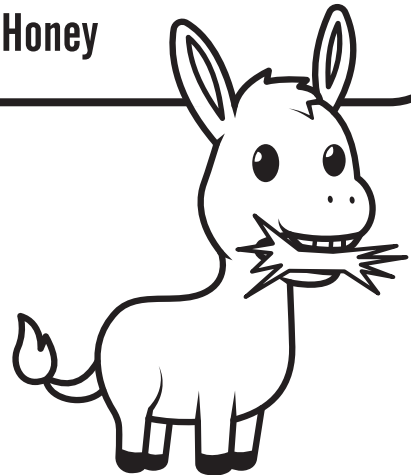

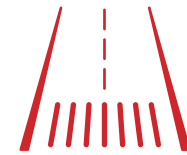

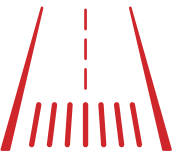
